

4-Day Marrakech to Sahara Desert Tour

(Marrakech – Atlas Mountains – Ait Ben Haddou – Dades – Todgha Gorge – Sahara – Draa Valley – Nkob - Marrakech)

Day 1: Marrakech – Atlas Mountains – Ait Ben Haddou – Dades Valley

Depart from Marrakech in the morning.

Cross the High Atlas Mountains via the Tizi n'Tichka Pass (2,260m), enjoying breathtaking views.

Visit the UNESCO-listed Ait Ben Haddou, an ancient ksar famous for its mud-brick architecture and Hollywood film settings.

Lunch in Ait Ben Haddou or Ouarzazate.

Continue through the Valley of Roses towards the Dades Valley, known for its rock formations and kasbahs.

Overnight stay in a traditional guesthouse in Dades Gorge with dinner.

Day 2: Dades Valley – Todgha Gorge – Merzouga (Sahara Desert Camp)

Breakfast at the hotel before heading to Todgha Gorge, a spectacular canyon with towering cliffs.

Explore the gorge, ideal for walking and photography.

Lunch in Tinghir before driving to the Sahara Desert (Merzouga).

Arrive in Merzouga and embark on a camel trek into the dunes to witness the sunset. '



Overnight in a luxury desert camp under the stars, with a traditional Berber dinner and music.



Day 3: Merzouga – Draa Valley – Nkob

Early morning sunrise over the dunes, followed by breakfast at camp.

Return by camel or 4x4 to Merzouga.

Drive through Alnif and the stunning Draa Valley, known as the longest palm oasis in Morocco.

Lunch in Nkob, a charming Berber village famous for its kasbahs and mountain views.

Overnight in Nkob at a traditional riad or guesthouse.

Day 4: Nkob – Agdz – Ouarzazate – Marrakech

Breakfast in Nkob before continuing through Agdz and the palm groves of the Draa Valley.

Cross the Tizi n'Tichka Pass back to Marrakech, arriving in the evening.
